Any act of inhumane treatment or abuse of a horse at any time whilst on the Rosedale Complex or in the vicinity, will not be tolerated and if discovered the Committee may immediately bar the responsible party and horse from further participation in the event

Riders must Register & collect Bib Numbers before walking any courses

Bib Numbers must be worn visibly at all times when competing or walking courses

The Bar will be open – **No BYO alcohol**

BYO Alcohol

- Competitors are reminded BYO alcohol is only permitted within your campsite.
This is a Licence condition.
- The Rosedale Complex is a glass free area
This is a Council condition

WILD CARD 2020

Any eligible Open Competitor who does not make the Top 10 will go in a draw for the 'Wild Card' to take part in the Wild Horse Catch and Stock Saddle Buckjump with opportunity to win the Prize Money for these Final Events.

- *Competitors who made Open Top 10 in 2019 are NOT eligible*
- *Competitors must nominate at Registration*
- *The Wild Card will be drawn on Saturday Evening before the Top 10 Calcutta*
- *Whatever the 'Wild Card' Competitor scores in these events is totally independent of the Top 10 Scores and will not affect the final places of the Open Challenge.*

STOCK WHIPS

UNLESS SPECIFIED IN THE RULES Challenge Events require a stockwhip to be carried ready for use

- Carrying a stockwhip in any way other than ready for use **20 penalties**
- Forgetting/dropping a stockwhip in an event/retrieving before finishing **20 penalties**
- Forgetting/dropping a stockwhip during an event and **not** retrieving it **50 penalties**

SCORES

- Competitors have a 10minute opportunity to view their own score & speak to the specific Event Manager immediately after the last member of each team completes an event, before scores are sent to the Scorer for validation.
- The Event Manager will respond to any initial query.
- At the discretion of an Event Manager, a Judge/s may be consulted
- Competitors must not approach a Judge unless requested to do so.

NB *After riding the WHIPCRACK course each competitor walks the course with the Judge.*

PROTESTS

If a competitor has further concern and wishes to protest, then the formal process must be adhered to

- A protest must be in writing on a KOTR Form and accompanied by \$100 fee
- Any protest must first be taken to the Riders' Representative who will refer it to the Protest Committee (*before 6pm that day*)
- The Protest Committee of three will be named at the Rider's Briefing and will include
1) **Riders' Representative* 2) *Challenge Committee Member* 3) *An Independent*

STOCKMAN'S VET AND GEAR CHECK

FRIDAY 28th February 2020 6.30am–8am Shoeing Tent (Refer Teams Schedule)

Competitors & Horses must walk to Marshalling Area 15 minutes before allotted time

- Horse to be fully saddled with halter, stock whip and oilskin etc
- Horse to be tied up in the designated area and stand alone for 15 minutes
- Competitors are to dress according to the appropriate stockman's theme which is required in each event
- Competitors do not need to present with their shoeing materials

VET CHECK

- Horses are to be fit and sound as determined by the Vet (not girth-galled /saddle sore)
- The horse *must* be able to be lead at a trot to the satisfaction of the vet.
- Should a horse be 'vetted out', the competitor may use a spare horse if it is presented to the Vet within 30 minutes and is determined to be sound.
- Horse's standing heart rate will be taken after the horse has been standing for at least 15 minutes and will be taken into consideration when the horse's recovery time is assessed for scoring on completion of the Cross Country event.
- The same horse must be used throughout the competition
- ***A horse with Ring Worm will not be permitted to stay on the Grounds at Rosedale***

NO EXCEPTIONS!

STOCKMAN'S GEAR CHECK

10% of this score will count towards the overall Challenge Score
There will be an award for the highest score in each Challenge (O, L, N, J)

- Riders' & Horses' gear and accessories must be in good condition and well maintained throughout the events.
- Gear must comply with recognised criteria of Australian stockmen's gear.
- Gear must be deemed by the judges to be safe and suited to rugged bush riding.
- Gear intended for use in the competition must be on the horse at the inspection.

NB: Judges are entitled ask Competitors to replace any gear deemed to be unsafe or unsuitable.

DRESS CODE (50 points): 10% of the score will count towards Challenge score
Assessed on appropriateness to the image of the traditional Australian Stockman

- Collared shirt with sleeves
- Appropriate style hat
- Safe riding boots
- Approved safety helmet for X/Country
- *EA standards*

(ASNZ 3838, AEB HS 2012, ASTM F1163, PAS 015, SNELL E2001, VGI)

NB: It is recommended that all riders have their own helmets

- Juniors **must** wear a safety helmet for all events
Juniors **must** wear a protective vest for Cross Country
- A full-length oilskin **must** be carried on the horse throughout all the events *Exceptions: Shoeing, Bareback Obstacle, Wild Horse Catch, Stock Saddle-Buckjump*
- Stockwhip

HORSE GEAR (50 points): 10% of the score will count towards Challenge Score
Assessed on well presented and maintained gear that complies with the recognised criteria of Australian stockmen's gear for daily work

- All gear must be in good, safe order and, if not, must be replaced and re-presented to the Judges or Competitor will not be allowed to continue with the competition
- Breastplates, surcingles and cruppers are recommended but are optional
- A correctly fitted running martingale (rings) is **only** permissible for the Cross Country
- Head checks are not permitted in any part of the competition
- Saddles and bridles presented during this event will be marked and the same gear must be used in all subsequent events (except the Bareback Obstacle & Shoeing)
- Should a bridle be broken during the Challenge, it may be replaced but the Competitor's **must** notify the Challenge Committee and request re-inspection

PACK HORSE & STOCK HANDLING

FRIDAY & SATURDAY 28-29 February 2020

Ring 2 (ref Teams Schedule for times)

***There will be a prizemoney for the highest score in each Challenge (O, L, N, J)
for both the Packhorse & Stockhandling events***

Course Maps will be available at Registration.

Competitors able to walk the Course & talk to Designers/Judge on Thursday (Time on P.A.)

**Short time available to walk this course on Friday at 6-7.00am and again after 5.30pm*

The Pack Horse and Stock Handling events take place in succession

There will be a time allowed for each phase - Course 6 mins + 1min / Stockhandling 4 mins.

A signal will sound when the packhorse time is up and 1 minute is allowed to resaddle

At the next signal the Stockhandling time starts 4 minutes

Packhorse and Stockhandling will be scored and timed separately

Stockwhip must be carried ready for use for Packhorse Obstacle and for all Stockhandling

PACK HORSE RULES

- The competition horse must be packed (*time allowed 6mins*)
- Lead horse must be saddled with Competitor's saddle (*any lead horse may be borrowed*)
- Competitor is to enter the start area on foot with both lead & competition horses.
Bags & swag are to be packed, saddle horse & secure bags etc.
Mount (*stockwhip ready for use*) & start Obstacle Course on signal. **20 points**
- Time start's on Judge's signal
Electronic timer will signal 6 mins. ***If not finished there is 1 minute to re- saddle***
As Competitor starts, his/her dog (*if being used*) will be released into the arena. (*Competitor must keep dog under control & discipline is judged from this point*)
There are 4 obstacles to negotiate (*ref course map*) **60 points**
Not completing an obstacle correctly will incur penalties (*ref course map*)
Missing or not attempting an obstacle incurs loss of those points *plus 2 penalties*
- On entering the campsite, the competitor must unpack, roll out swag & set up camp, saddle the competition horse, mount and be ready to start stockhandling
Judge will raise a flag when rider is resaddled etc (*Time is taken at this point*) **20 points**
Total 100 points

If finished under time Competitor may cross the exit line from campsite & start the Stockhandling

NOTE:

- ***Packhorse time is taken when Judge signals that the competitor has resaddled and is ready to start the Stockhandling***
- ***At the 6min signal competitor must leave the obstacle course if not finished & go directly to the campsite to resaddle the competition horse.***
- ***After 1 minute to resaddle the signal sounds & Stockhandling time of 4mins starts***
- ***Count backs will be decided on the fastest time***

NB: Packsaddle & lead horse will remain at the campsite & be removed by a Steward

STOCKHANDLING RULES

1. Stockhandling time starts with the *electronic buzzer*
2. Time allowed is 4 minutes
3. Dog is in arena from the start of the Packhorse obstacle & dog discipline points apply
4. It is compulsory to carry a whip ready for use (*ref P3*)
5. Competitor must enter the camp and cut out one of the three beasts using campdraft format
6. Maximum for cut out is 20 points (*strictly at judge's discretion*)
Competitors may choose what to do with their dog during the Cut Out
Competitor may chain the dog at the Camp for a loss of 4 dog points
7. When cut-out is complete the competitor is to signal for cattle to be released from the camp (Note: *if dog is chained Competitor must release*) and will continue around the course in a controlled manner.
8. There are four obstacles, 2@10 points 2@7points – a total of 34 course points.
All cattle must pass through an obstacle to gain points for that obstacle*
**Obstacle 1 and 2 Half points (5) for easy route Max points (10) for harder route*
 - There are no horse-work points as per Campdrafting.
 Stockmanship points will be allocated for the way riders control stock using horse and dog to achieve the desired outcome.
 - The competitor **must ride each obstacle in succession** otherwise no course points will be given - only stockmanship points.
 - Using a dog is not compulsory but dog work carries a possible 22 pts
 - Outside help working the dog is not allowed and will incur loss of all dog points
 - Count backs will be decided on the fastest time

HORSESHOEING

FRIDAY & SATURDAY 28-29 February 2020

There will be prize money for the highest score in each Challenge (O, L, N, J)

Stall jacks have replaced anvils for all competitors

Horseshoes, nails and stall jacks will be supplied by the Challenge Committee.

Competitors are to supply all other shoeing gear.

Competitors are required to provide a quiet horse & someone to hold it - *no tying to fence*

All horses' feet must be in reasonable condition with *at least 5-6 weeks growth*.

Mistreatment of a shoeing horse will result in disqualification from the Horseshoeing

****Should any blood from the horse result from the use of tools or a driven nail - zero points***

A stockwhip is not required to be carried.

OPEN LADIES NOVICE TIME ALLOWED: 40 MINUTES

- Tools allowed at the Stall Jack will be a **shaping hammer** and **pritchel** only
- Shoeing apron, hoof stand, tool-box or wrap with **tools of your choice** allowed at the horse
- Competitors are required to demonstrate the ability to prepare and apply a shoe to one front and one back hoof within 40 minutes ***Assessed on suitability for Mountain Riding**
- One front foot and one hind foot are to be prepared for shoeing. Then the competitor must call the Judge who will view the prepared feet
- Select appropriate size shoes (one front, one hind) supplied by Stockman's Supplies
- Cold shape and fit shoes ***Shoe to the foot**
- Nail shoes on, clinch nails and finish, then call the judge to view the finished work
- Competitors will be judged on the balance and serviceability of the job.
- NB: ***Forging is how well the shoe has been shaped without hammer marks all over it, nail- holes haven't been closed up, the clip is set and the shoe is level***

JUNIOR TIME ALLOWED: 40 MINUTES

- Clean and trim either a front or hind foot, then call the Judge.
- Judged on level, sole & frog prep with knife & rasp work on front of hoof
- Select a front or a hind shoe supplied by Stockman's Supplies.
- Using the stall jack provided shape the shoe to fit the trimmed foot
- Under supervision of a peer use 4 nails to nail shoe on ****This phase is optional***

BAREBACK

FRIDAY & SATURDAY 28-29 February 2020

The Bareback Area is beyond Caravan & Camping (*Refer to venue map*)

There will be a prize money for the best score in each Challenge (O, L, N, J)

Obstacle Course

REQUIREMENTS AND JUDGING CRITERIA

- Course map available at Registration. Course open for walking from 11am Thurs
- Horse's head gear may be bridle, halter, rope or nothing.
- There are no specific headgear points, but the headgear used will be considered when awarding Horsemanship points
- A bell will mark the start of the obstacle course
- Riders are to complete the course as quickly and neatly as possible. They will be judged on riding style and the horse's ability to accept the tasks before them.
- Two Judges will determine whether the obstacles have been negotiated in a manner that in their view was correct and precise (*the quicker & neater the better*)
- In case of a fall from the horse, the rider may remount and continue but will lose twenty (20) points as well as some horsemanship points

Course	70 points
Horsemanship	20 points
Freestyle	10 points
TOTAL	<u>100 points</u>

Note:

- Judges will not confer when awarding Horsemanship points
- The 2 scores will be added and averaged
- In case of equal top points, a count back will be on fastest time on course.

Freestyle

- Competitors have 1 minute to perform a trick worth a possible 10 points
- **No whip cracking is allowed** (*There is a Freestyle Whip Cracking section for this*)
- Props are allowed but **must** be on hand and easily accessible
- Two Judges will score without conferring and their scores will be averaged

WHIPCRACK

FRIDAY 28 FEBRUARY 2020

Ring 1 (See Teams Schedule for times)

There will be prize money for the best score in each Challenge (O, L, N, J)

Whipcrack Target

Requirements:

- Competitors will attempt to cleanly cut targets with a stock whip within a set time
- Time will be based on a fast canter and announced on Thursday
- A map will be provided to each Competitor at Registration showing course details
- More than one whip may be carried
- Either preferred hand may be used for targets
- Only one attempt at each target by a Competitor is allowed and must be on a downward stroke. Competitor is not allowed to stop.
- Failure to cross the line between the trees to start and finish results in **elimination**
- Should a Competitor fall he/she may remount and continue.
- Competitors **must** finish the course
- Time penalties apply if the competitor completes the course after the time allowed

12 Targets @ 5 points each 60 points

3 Targets @10 points each 30 points

Freestyle 10 points

Total 100 points

****If there are equal top points the fastest time on course will be used for a count back***

Freestyle

- Competitors will complete their Whipcrack Freestyle on horseback **standing still** immediately following the Whipcrack Target Course.
- The judge will give a signal to start
- Time allowed is 30 seconds

CROSS COUNTRY COURSE

SATURDAY 29 FEBRUARY 2020

There will be prize money for the best score in each Challenge (O, L, N, J)

NB: Course maps available at Registration. Course will be open for walking from 11am Thursday
Competitors may walk the course (no horses) at any time prior to the X/Country Rider's Briefing
Sat 2.00pm *Optional* conducted unmounted course walk followed by *Compulsory* Rider's Briefing

REQUIREMENTS & JUDGING CRITERIA

- Officials may ask competitors to replace any equipment found to be unsuitable or unsafe.
- All Competitors *must* wear a safety helmet
- Juniors *must* wear a protective vest and it is strongly advised for all Competitors
- Competitors must carry a full-length oilskin on the horse and stockwhip ready for use for the duration of the course.
- 20 obstacles (logs, ditches, tyres, gates etc) will be over a course of approx 2km.
- All jumps will be numbered and flagged, red on the right and white on the left.
- 4 points scored for each jump cleared (*one attempt only*) A refusal attracts a zero score.
- Competitors will only be scored on the first attempt at each jump. If unsuccessful, rider must move on to the next jump.
- Competitors may ride around an obstacle without elimination (*Nil points for that obstacle*)
- The Jump Judges may stop any competitor with a pink flag in the event of an emergency.
 If a competitor is stopped on course, their 'down-time' will be recorded and subtracted from their total time on course.
- Following a fall of horse and/or rider as a result of a jump the competitor must retire
 The jumping score to that point with 20 penalties will be recorded
- A fall of horse and/or rider on the flat (*not as a result of a jump*) does not incur penalties
- If a horse escapes following a fall on the flat or as a result of a jump the rider is eliminated
- Competitors must go to the cool-down area following completion of the course
- On finishing, Riders will be given a card with their Vet inspection time (10 minutes later)
- Horses are to be unsaddled and presented to the vets exactly 10 minutes after completion.
- Competitors must remain in the cool-down area until completion of the vet check
- The Vet will assess the horse's heart rate and recovery time after the course
- There will be an Optimum Time for the course with speed based on 425m per minute
- Time faults for being *over* this time are calculated at .4 fault/sec over
- More than 20 seconds *under the Optimum Time* also attracts faults.
- Watches are allowed.
- Excessive time wasting at the end of the course will reflect in the Equitation points awarded
- Jumping Equitation will be judged throughout the Cross-Country Course

WILD HORSE CATCH

- Horses will be drawn on Sunday morning at the Secretary's Office. (*Time TBC*)
Any competitor not present will have their horse drawn by a Committee member.
- ***There will be a Rider Briefing following the draw***
- Only a halter may be used to catch the horse. Catching ropes or any gear with a Honda at either end cannot be used.
- Competitors are to supply their own halters. ***All halters will be inspected. No modifications e.g. wire, allowed and halters must have a flat plait across poll.***
- Competitors will start inside the arena
- At the Judge's discretion, a **2 minute** time limit will commence after the horse has settled in the arena.
- In the event of a fall, a competitor may remount and continue. (*barring injury*)
- If a horse is caught and time allows, a competitor may attempt to lead the horse and show control
- If a Judge considers the horse being caught is over-stressed, he may stop the competitor but not disqualify them.
- If a substitute horse cannot be provided the competitor will be scored to that point.

Disqualifications

- There will be no wraps or dallys around any part of the saddle or riding horse with halter lead. This will result in disqualification.
- Deliberate mistreatment of either horse will result in disqualification.
- Foul language will result in disqualification.

Judging Criteria

- There will be two Judges.
- **Unlimited attempts are allowed.**
(*An attempt is considered when the halter leaves the throwing hand.*)
- A straight halter catch will gain more points than a neck- catch.

- Competitors are to supply their own halters. **All halters will be inspected.**
No modifications e.g. wire, allowed and halters must have a flat plait across poll.
- Competitors will start inside the arena
- At the Judge's discretion, **3 minute** time limit will commence after the horse has settled in the arena.
- In the event of a fall, a competitor may remount and continue. (barring injury)
- If a horse is caught and time allows, a competitor must attempt to lead the horse and show control
- If a Judge considers the horse being caught is over-stressed, he may stop the competitor
- but not disqualify them
- If a substitute horse cannot be provided the competitor will be scored to that point.

Disqualifications

STOCK SADDLE BUCKJUMP

Horses will be drawn on Sunday morning at the Secretary's Office following the WHC Draw.

NB: All care possible will be taken by The King of the Ranges Committee to provide the competitors with safe bucking stock. However, this is a hazardous sport and again it is stressed that competitors continue at their own risk.

Gear will be checked prior to riding

- Saddle used in the Final must be same saddle used throughout the Competition.
- No back girths allowed
- No breast-plate allowed
- No bind between the stirrups allowed
- Crupper is optional
- Chaps are optional
- Regulation spurs only. **(No side rollers, fixed or sharpened spurs are allowed)**

Judging Criteri

- There will be two Judges.
- Competitors are judged on an 8 second ride
- Mark out rule does not apply
- No grab down allowed
- Riders will attempt to crack a stockwhip & show control during the ride.
- Re-rides are at the Judges' discretion.

There will be no re-ride given if a competitor's gear breaks
